# A WORLD OF CHANGE

## A NEW CHAPTER BEGINS FOR GOLDEN TEE GOLF

They came together for the first time in 2002. 32 men of different nationalities, with different accents and similar apprehensions about the people and the event that lay ahead. They flew across states and seas to Orlando, Florida, with nothing more in common than their love for a video game and their extraordinary talent.

It was an important event in the history of Golden Tee Golf. It was the first Golden Tee World Championship.

Sixteen of the greatest American Golden Tee players shook hands with sixteen of their counterparts from Canada, Europe, Australia and New Zealand. For the first time, the scope of the world's most popular coin-operated amusement game was put into perspective and the birth of an international brotherhood was tangible evidence of its success.

But the warm feelings of global solidarity would only last so long.

Golden Tee players are fierce competitors. The World Championship puts

international pride on the line along with a \$57,000 prize pool. Like any other athlete competing on a high-stakes stage, they came to win.

Advantage, America.

The Americans came to the Championship in 2002 with years of major live event experience. The World Team not only lost to the Yanks in the inaugural event, they lost by a landslide. Year one taught the World Team a critical lesson to the tune of 35-13. That year, American Graig Kinzler dominated the field and was crowned the first ever Golden Tee World Champion. The World had some catching up to do.

2003 was a memorable year in Championship history. Notably, South Africa was welcomed to the global squad and Team U.K. became Team Europe due to the inclusion of Sweden in their finals. While some progress was made, the sophomore World Team was humbled again to the tune of 28-20. American Chris

Eversole narrowly beat Canadian Tim Glenn for the 2004 World Champion title. The World Team succeeded in proving their point that the gap was narrowing.

2004 was touted as the "Year of the World Team" from start to finish. After two years of coming up short, they were ready. So ready that Glenn, the 2003 World Team captain, publicly guaranteed an international victory in a pre-event interview. While some believed his words were an idle threat to intimidate the Americans, Glenn was speaking from the heart.

The dramatic plot came together like a blockbuster movie script. It couldn't have played out any more perfectly. With unbridled enthusiasm and an incredible team effort backing up their brash words, the World Team won the Cup and made history.

"Ever since we first saw the Cup in 2002, we knew that this day would come," said 2004 World Team captain, Anthony Goertz, of Kitchener,

Ontario, Canada. "Every point counted and it was thrilling to be captain of such a historical team!"

Every point indeed. From Team Canada's amazing 12-point contribution, to South Africa's crucial addition of 1.5 points to the World Team tally. The World Team won the Cup by the smallest of margins - a mere one point. South Africa's share not only represented 6% of the total tally, but it also served as proof that the times had changed. The world had caught up to America.

But the Americans didn't let them take it all.

The World Team hoped to sweep the Americans and take the individual title as well, but a humble baker from St. Louis had a different plan. As if he were single-handedly making up for his team's lackluster performance the day before, Jeff Harlow put together a string of some of the most phenomenal Golden Tee play in the history of the game. For eight straight hours, Harlow used perfection as his main defense against a series of the world's greatest Golden Tee players. His dominance ultimately earned him a \$15,000 check and the highest honor in Golden Tee: The title of World Champion.

"Those were some of the greatest days in my life," Harlow says while he



reflects on the 2004 Championship. "It's been a year now and I am still ecstatic about it. The Worlds is a great event, with great people - and I've been counting the days till 2005."

2005 is finally here and my-oh-my, how the times have changed.

As the Cup was passed and checks were presented, it marked the end of an era for Golden Tee Golf. Golden Tee Fore!, the award-winning, highly acclaimed version that stood at the inaugural World Championship, was retired to make way for the newest phenomenon in video sports history: Golden Tee LIVE.

Incredible Technologies released Golden Tee LIVE to the public in April 2005 and the game has been on a steamroll of success ever since. LIVE connects thousands of players around the world in real-time video golf tournaments. Players in America, Canada and the United Kingdom have already been competing against each other for prizes from thousands of miles apart and the rest of the Golden Tee playing community will be connected in the near future. For the first time since LIVE's auspicious release these players will face-off on the new game in the most important head-to-head event of the year. The winner of this year's title will not just walk away a Golden Tee champion, he will be the first-ever Golden Tee LIVE champion.

2005 marks a monumental year of change for the world's most popular video sport. As another piece of Golden Tee's remarkable tale comes to a close, a new chapter begins. Welcome to a new day. Welcome to Golden Tee LIVE and the 2005 World Championship!

### Golden Tee World Championship 2005: The Reigning Champion World Team

---

#### NEW ZEALAND

The Kiwis have been a part of the Golden Tee World Championship since its inception in 2002. Their unassuming two-man team never ceases to stun the rest of the field with true talent and an advanced understanding of the game. The players from this small island country have an impressive track record, including a top four finish in 2002.

New Zealand is a nation with a passion for sports and competition. Mike Taylor of NZ Golden Tee distributor Coin Cascade says that the same sentiment holds true for their Golden Tee players. "Being the best in New Zealand is a great honor for our players," Taylor said, "but they are more concerned about where they stand against the world. "

As always, two Kiwis qualified for the



coveted World Championship trip. To make the team, the New Zealand players competed in a variety of Golden Tee Fore! 2005 online qualifiers to earn an invitation to the New Zealand Championship held in Auckland on October 16th. The Kiwi champion and runner-up earned the chance to represent their country in Orlando.

Taylor adds that last year's World Team victory was the highlight of the year for Golden Tee players across New Zealand. "In previous years the Americans showed their dominance, but the Kiwis were very proud to help turn that around!"

One Kiwi that has been an integral part of the team's World Championship success is four-time World Team member Martin Awatere, of Wellington. Martin, or "Maz" as he is affectionately called by his teammates, has represented NZ in the Championship every year and his history of top-ten performances have single handedly put the country on the map as top World Championship contenders.

2005 presents a major challenge for the New Zealand team since they have had little exposure to Golden Tee LIVE leading up to the event. Regardless of the circumstances, raw Golden Tee skill and sheer determination are sure to prevail from the very experienced Kiwis.



### SOUTH AFRICA

With just two years of World Championship experience under their belts, the South Africans head back to Orlando to defend the Cup along side their international mates. Their crucial 1.5-point contribution in the 2004 World Team victory has been the talk of the South African Golden Tee community, as well as their motivation to defend the title in 2005.

Geoff Beeton of Golden Tee distributor, K & W Amusements, says that the South Africans have a history of being the underdogs in the championship. "Being the underdog is an advantage," Beeton said. "It means the opposition thinks it's an easy victory. We took a point-and-a-half by surprise last year and look at the difference it made!"

South Africa is a country with a passion for golf. As the home of some of the world's most famous professional golfers and courses it's no wonder why the country has embraced Golden Tee with such open arms. In only three short years South Africa's player and game population has nearly doubled each year. While the popularity of the

game continues to thrive, so has the popularity of live tournaments.

Beeton says that the largest live event this year was the South African National Championship this past July in Durban. "A total of 48 players from around South Africa were invited this year," Beeton said. "We played head-to-head knock down rounds until there were only two guys left. The event was especially exciting, because the winners got a spot in Orlando," he added.

With only eleven Golden Tee LIVE machines on test in South Africa throughout the past months, practice will be a crucial component of the team's confidence. Despite the changing times, Beeton's confident South African attitude remains. "It will be difficult to repeat as champions," he said. "But remember - we did it once and we can do it again!"

### AUSTRALIA

The Australians have proven themselves to be one of the best-kept secrets in Golden Tee Golf. Though the team is comprised of only two men, their dedication and determination for success has proven the Aussies as top contenders year-after-year. After their lights out performance



in the team competition in 2004, the boys from down under have established a reputation that demands to be reckoned with.

"The key to our team is old Aussie determination and the diehard will to win," said Bruce Colbourne of Australia's Amusement Machine Distributors. "The World Team beat the Americans in '04 because of team spirit and the belief that it was possible." That determination has once again motivated the players of the Australian GT community to succeed. "The World Championship is a dream come true for our players and qualifying for the team is very important to them," Colbourne explains. 32 other qualifiers had to compete in a live playoff in Sydney to determine this year's team. "After last year, everyone wants a chance to represent the Aussies in Orlando," he added.

Golden Tee's popularity has grown each year since it was first released on the island continent in September of 2001. Nearly 300 games stand in pubs across the nation and their players' scores are on the same pace as the game's global elite. With Golden Tee LIVE just beginning to test in the country, players are counting on their skills from Golden Tee Fore! to help them defeat the Americans in Orlando.

Colbourne acknowledged the Aussies limited acquaintance to the game and said, "We may not have had as much time with Golden Tee LIVE, but our guys will definitely give it their best shot in Orlando."

## EUROPE

Europe has the third largest Golden Tee population in the world with over 2,000 machines in pubs across the

land. The four-man team, formerly known as Team U.K., represents video golfers from the U.K., Sweden, Ireland and Finland. With well over 30,000 registered players and 9 years of Golden Tee experience, the team's level of play has reached a maturity that makes them one of the top contenders in the world.

Kevin Weir of Electrocoin, Ltd., Golden Tee's distributor in Europe, says that it didn't shock him when the World Team won in 2004. "Everyone in the world has learned from the Americans and gotten better at the game," Weir explains. "The World Team winning inspired more European players to try to qualify this year. Crikey! They're still talking about the victory today!"

Hundreds of players from across Europe attempted to qualify for a coveted spot on the World Team at the European Championship on October 16th in Watford, England. "This year we had players from England, Sweden and Scotland competing for a spot on the team," Weir explained. "We even opened it up to some of our bronze-level champs! Everyone has heard the tales from Orlando and they all want to be a part of the team," he added.

Team Europe is optimistic about competing on LIVE at the World Championship and they are hoping that they've practiced enough on the new platform. "LIVE has been on test in Europe only throughout the summer," Weir said. "It will be tough to pull together to beat the Americans on this new game."

Team Europe is notorious for being the life of the party at past World Championships. Weir explains that whether the team wins or loses this year, they are just here for the beer! A fitting motto for a team so full of energy and spirit.

## CANADA

America's neighbors to the north have built themselves quite a reputation in the global Golden Tee community. Canadian Golden Tee players make up the largest part of the World Team and their international partners unanimously call them the "backbone" of the squad each year. With nearly 4,000 Golden Tees in bars and pubs across the great country and over 50,000 registered players, the game has quickly become an institution in the Great White North.

Gary Walters of ITS Canada says that Canadian Golden Tee players take tremendous pride in the game.



"There's been an ongoing debate between our players and the Americans about who is the best," Walters explains. "The World Championship is serious business for us and it sets a perfect stage for them to play out the challenge."

There's no denying that the Canadians can go shot-for-shot with the Yanks. In 2004, the Canucks were responsible for nearly half of the points in the World Team victory, not to mention that a Canadian has made it to the individual finals each year since 2002. Second only to the Americans in years of GT experience, Canada comes to Orlando in 2005 as focused and determined than ever before.

"With the recent launch of LIVE around the globe, winning won't be easy this year," Walters said. "We believe that our team spirit and drive can take us all the way again. We tasted victory once and we are hungry again this year!" he added.

The Canadians qualify their team members with the utmost scrutiny.

After three live events in Alberta, Toronto and Saskatchewan, top qualifiers from each were invited to compete in the Canadian National Championship in Toronto on October 30th.

With such an arduous qualification schedule in place, Walters is positive his team will be ready in '05. "Our players are highly competitive and truly excited to defend the world crown in Orlando," he exclaimed.

#### TEAM USA

America - home of the Red, White, Blue and Golden Tee. The famed video golf game has reached iconic levels in the States, with over 60,000 games standing in bars and taverns from coast-to-coast. It's estimated that the Americans alone spin over 50,000,000 games each year. In a nation known for its competitive spirit and sporting culture, Golden Tee has become ingrained into the social fabric of America.

The Golden Tee phenomenon

started in the U.S. in 1995 with the release of Golden Tee 3-D Golf. But it wasn't until 2000, the advent of Golden Tee Fore!, that the famed golf game took America by storm. Since then Golden Tee has grown into a global empire with legions of devoted fans. Once the video golf fever became an international epidemic in 2002, the Golden Tee World Championship was born and the rest has been history for the Americans.

3 events, 3 American World Champions and 2 Team USA Championships. Even despite last year's stunning upset, the Americans still lead the World Team on the overall scoreboard 86.5 to 65.5.

"The increased dedication and talent levels of our guys each year never ceases to amaze me," said Scott Morrison, VP of marketing for Incredible Technologies. "The Americans have a true love for the game and it shows on the leaderboards."

## 2004 GOLDEN TEE WORLD CHAMPIONSHIP TEAMS!



This year, the Team USA leaderboards told an impressive tale for the Yanks. With over 1,000 players qualifying online the top 50-game average score just missed a record shattering -30! And since the launch of Golden Tee LIVE this past December in the States, the American video golfers have competed in over 120,000 LIVE contests for "Prizes" or "Glory".

But the Americans are focused on topping the year's most important leaderboard - The World Championship team competition. 2004 Team USA member and reigning World Champion, Jeff Harlow, says that the Americans are ready to reclaim the Cup in 2005. "We were outplayed by the underdogs last year," Harlow said. "The World Team definitely deserved the victory in '04, but this year we do not intend to let it slip away."

Team USA 2005 is a collection of the greatest video golfers the United States has to offer. Since the world famous ITS tournament system was retired to make way for Golden Tee LIVE, this year's U.S. team does not segregate its players within divisions. From head-to-toe, Team USA 2005 is a mighty powerhouse.

The 16-man team is comprised of 2 exempt players and the top 14 qualifiers from the live Team USA Qualifier held in Atlanta, Georgia this past October. Harlow, and five-time Player of the Year, Dean Liakakos, form the foundation of the team and 72 of the country's top online qualifiers battled for the remaining spots.

Though the Americans admit they have had the most exposure to Golden Tee LIVE, there is no complacency within the team. "These guys are always tough," Harlow said about the World Team. "They are finally playing like we knew they could play and while we hope to win in 2005, we know it's not going to be easy."



**Dean Liakakos is a 39-year-old pool hall owner from Dayton, Ohio. 10 years ago Dean began playing Golden Tee with his buddies to have a good time and a little friendly competition. As time passed, Dean realized he was talented at the game and decided it may be wise to try his hand in a more competitive format. How truly wise he was.**

**Today Dean has become one of the most decorated players in Golden Tee Golf, with countless tournament victories, an absurd amount of prize winnings and an unprecedented 5 Player-of-the-Year Championships under his belt. This video golf game has brought Dean a unique level of fame, some mild fortune and even a little happiness, but when you ask him what it all means his response is simple - it's about the people. An entire world of them.**

**After experiencing the first World Championship in 2002, Dean has become Golden Tee's de facto global ambassador. He's crisscrossed the globe to do nothing more than play the same video game that stands in his bar, King's Table Billiards, in Dayton. And he does it for the people.**

**Whether it's sipping pints of Guinness in a London pub with the Brits or having a bottle of Budweiser at his pool hall in Dayton, Dean speaks the international language of Golden Tee Golf. He plays Golden Tee for the love of the game and the people who play it. The story and sentiments of this humble champion embody the true spirit of the Golden Tee World Championship.**
